Overview

The sighted records for the Parish of Frittenden show that the first Hickmotts to live there were James and Elizabeth Hickmott nee Pennall who were married at Maidstone but had at least seven children at Frittenden between 1748 and 1760. Virtually all of the Hickmotts recorded at Frittenden from the mid-1700s until the early 1900s were descendants of James and Elizabeth and two of their sons:

- a. Stephen Hickmott (1746-1842) who married Elizabeth Burges (1760-1833) at Frittenden in 1783 and had eleven children there between 1784 and 1798; and
- b. William Hickmott (1756-1839) who married Sarah Gower (1762-1815) at Frittenden in 1794 and had six children there between 1795 and 1807 (the children were baptized at the Cranbrook Independent Church).

It is possible that James was born at Horsmonden in 1717, the son of William Hickmott (known as William of 'Buckingfielday') and Sarah Yeomans who were both from Yalding but were married at West Farleigh in 1714. A Sarah Hickmott, a widow born around 1687, was buried at Frittenden in 1777. The UK censuses, 1798 Land Tax Redemption Records and other sources show that James and a number of his sons and grandsons were tenant farmers whose properties around Frittenden included: 'Pore Farm', 'Lashenden Farm', 'Balcomb Farm', 'Buckhurst Hill', 'Great Bubhurst' and 'Copland Farm'.

Virtually no members of other lines of the extended Hickmott family came to live at Frittenden in the period described. A number of the later descendants of James Hickmott and Elizabeth Pennall were married outside the parish, but most of these returned to Frittenden and had all or most of their children there. A few moved away from the parish to live and work in such other places as Cranbrook, Headcorn, Smarden, and Maidstone (all in Kent). Only one couple we are aware of, Elizabeth Hickmott and her husband, Ernest James Joy Mace from Brenchley, moved much further afield, to Akron in the State of Ohio in the United States of America.

The 1851 census has Stephen (61 year-old farmer of 38 acres) and Elizabeth (61, Frittenden) living at Little Bubhurst in Frittenden with their unmarried son Thomas (33, Frittenden) and two servants (Mary Godfrey and James Sharpe). Thomas (50 year-old farmer) and Mary (45) living at 'Pore House' in Frittenden with their six children - Thomas (25), James (20), William (15), Edward (13), Mary (10) and Harriet (8) – and a 13 year-old servant, Susannah Godfrey. The 1851 census shows Thomas (62 year-old farmer of 60 acres) and Mary Ann (58, Frittenden) still at Pore Farm in Frittenden. Also present were their two children - Harriet (18, Frittenden) and Edward (23 year-old carpenter, Frittenden) – and a 16 year-old servant, Joseph Nye. Next door at 'Chapple Cottage' was their son James (31, Frittenden) with his wife Sarah (26, Biddenden) and their three children: James (6), Rachel (2) and Stephen (6 weeks) all of who were born at Frittenden. The 1861 census shows Thomas (72 year-old farmer of 55 acres) and Mary Ann (68) at 'Buckhurst Lane Farm' in Frittenden. With them were William (18), James (14) and Mary A. Hickmott (14) all of whom were described as servants and were born at Frittenden. Thomas died at Frittenden in 1866. The 1871 census shows Mary Ann (79 year-old former farmer) living at 'White Cottage' in Frittenden with her son John (49) and his wife Harriet Hickmott (49) and their son William (29) and granddaughter Mary Ann Hickmott (4) where all were born at Frittenden. Mary Ann, aged 79, died there the following year. Known children, all born at Frittenden; Stephen (1813-13), Thomas (1815), Stephen (1817), James (1819), William (1819), John (1822), William (1823), James (1825), David (1826), Edward (1827), Mary Ann (1830) and Harriet (1833).

The 1841 census shows an Edward (40 year-old farmer) and Ann Munk (40) living at Great Bubhurst in Frittenden with their four children: John (20), Edward (15), William (15) and Sally Munk (13). The 1851 census shows Edward (52, Smarden) and Ann (53, Frittenden) at Bubhurst in Frittenden with two children – William (27) and Sally Ann (22) – and Edward's widower father, John Munk (73 year-old retired farmer born at Smarden) and five servants. Ann died and was buried at Frittenden in 1868.

We think Ann was born at Biddenden in around 1790 although that has still to be confirmed (the LDS index shows that an Ann Tolhurst, daughter of Samuel and Mary, was baptized at Biddenden in 1792). The 1841 census has a James (50) and Ann Hickmott (50) living on Water Lane in Maidstone with three of his children: James (20), Leonard (10) and Charlotte (8). The Maidstone parish registers show that James (56 of Water Lane Maidstone) died there in 1846. The 1851 census has the widowed Ann (60, born either in Kent or London) lodging in West Maidstone with Leonard (20 year-old groom) and Charlotte (17 year-old shoe binder). Known children: James (1821, Frittenden, William (1823, Maidstone), Leonard (1829, Maidstone) and Charlotte (1833, Maidstone).

The LDS index shows that an Elizabeth Pennick Thirkle, the daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth, was baptized at Benenden in 1799. The 1851 census shows John (56 year-old farmer of 24 acres and grocer born at Frittenden) and Elizabeth (52, Benenden) at Balcombe House in Frittenden with five children, all born at Frittenden: Elizabeth B. (26), William (19), Olive (15), Hannah (18) and Eleanor E. (11). They were still there in 1861 together with: William (29), Olive (25) and Eleanor (21). John died and was buried at Frittenden on 21 October 1861. The 1871 census shows the widowed Elizabeth (71, Benenden) at the home of Eleanor (31, Frittenden) and William West (32 year-old butcher born at Crodon in Surrey) at 16 North End in Croydon. Also present were William and Eleanor's children – Eleanor (7), William (3), John (1) and Kate (1m) all of whom were born at Croydon - as well as Eleanor's two sisters: Elizabeth B. (45) and Hannah Hickmott (33) as well as three servants. Elizabeth died at Croydon in 1878. Known children all baptized at Frittenden: Elizabeth Burges (1825),	Maidstone	mkmi]

(wit: John & Eliz Hickmott) William was born at Frittenden in around 1897, the son of William Hickmott and Sarah Gower (who were married at Frittenden in 1794). The 1841 census shows William (40 year-old farmer) and Lydia (35) at Eastwood in Ulcombe with their two children – William (3) and Elizabeth (1) – and two servants: Sarah and Sophia Watts. Lydia died, aged 38, in 1842 and was buried at Frittenden. The 1851 census has the widower William (52 year-old farmer of 130 acres born at Frittenden) at Lashenden Farm with his unmarried brother James (59), two children – William (12) and Elizabeth (10) – and four servants. William (61) and James (59) and William's two children were still there in 1861 plus two servants. William died at Frittenden in 1868. Known children: William (1838, Ulcombe), Elizabeth (1840, Ulcombe). We think William jnr never married and died a gentleman at Biddenden in 1894 (probate to Richard Samson, farmer, and John Amherst Philpott, gentleman).

In view of the witnesses, we think that Thomas was the son (born at Frittenden in around 1815) of Thomas and Mary Ann Hickmott nee Wraight (who were married at Frittenden in 1813). We suspect that Elizabeth died at Frittenden in 1838/9 while giving birth to the couple's daughter Emily (who died the same day – see below). The 1841 census shows Thomas (25 year-old agricultural labourer) living with his parents and siblings at Pore Farm in Frittenden. We think that Thomas later married the widow Alice Bowles in the Cranbrook RD in 1846. He and she had a daughter, Mary Ann Hickmott, before John's death at Frittenden in 1857.

Census data and the MIs for Smarden indicate that Jane was born at 'Halden' in Kent and died at Smarden in 1857, aged 40 years. The 1841 census shows Silas (35 year-old farmer) and Jane (20) living at Friend House in Frittenden with their son James (1) and a female servant, Esther Watts. Silas (45, Frittenden) and Jane (34, Halden) were still at Friend Farm in 1851 along with their children: James (11), Jane (9), Mary (7), Elizabeth (3) and William (6m) all of whom were born at Frittenden. Jane died at Frittenden on 16 July 1857, leaving eight children. The 1861 census shows the widower Silas (54 year-old farmer of 18 acres) living at Weaver Den House in Frittenden with his seven children: Jane (19), Mary (17), Elizabeth (13), William (10), Ellen (7), Silas (4) and Anne (4). Silas died at Weaversden Farm on 13 February 1870. His will was proved by Thomas Chapman of North Lodge Staplehurst and James Pearson of Admans Green Farm Smarden. Known children all born at Frittenden: James (1840), Jane (1842), Mary (1843), Benjamin (1845-47), Elizabeth (1848), William (1851-69), Ellen (1854), Silas (1857) and Anne or Nancy (1857).</p>
