Personal details	<p>1. Edward Hickmott was born at Woolwich in Kent in around 1880 and enlisted there on 13 August 1914. Allocated to the 3rd Battalion 'The Buffs' as a 'special reservist mobilized', he had earlier served in South Africa with the 2nd Battalion of the Northamptonshire Regiment and after that in India with the same regiment's 1st Battalion. There is some confusion over exactly when Edward went to France. A letter written after the war by his father requesting his son's medals, states Edward 'went to France soon after the beginning of the war... came to England for a few days as an escort to 800 German prisoners' and returned to France on about 17 January 1915. Edward's Army record listed his WWI military service as comprising: 1) a 'Home' posting (extending from 13 August 1914 to 16 January 1915 and during which he was charged three times and served a total of 22 days confinement to barracks) and 2) service in France with the British Expeditionary Force from 17 January 1915 to 14 April 1915 when he was killed in action in Belgium. His name is inscribed on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial.</p> <p>2. Philip George Hickmott, was born at Kensington in London in 1892 and married his first cousin, Nora Jessie Setter (1884-1981), the second eldest daughter of George Setter and Caroline Elizabeth Hickmott, at Camberwell in London in 1912. He joined the colours on 29 December 1914 and served in France with the Royal Army Ordinance Corps before being posted to Italy where he died while on active service from the effects of influenza on 29 October 1918. He is buried in the Arquata Scrivia Communal Cemetery Extension. His wife, Nora Jessie Setter, was then living at 3 Eswyn Road in Tooting in London. She and Philip had no children.</p> <p>3. James Harry Hickmott was born at Battersea in London in 1882 and worked as a racing groom and police constable before leaving England in May 1912 to live and work in Rhodesia. Following the outbreak of war, he joined the 2nd Battalion of the Rhodesian Regiment and returned to England in September 1917. He died of endocarditis in Hampshire on 31 August 1918 and is among 117 servicemen buried in the Bordon Military Cemetery there. We don't know if he had married in Rhodesia.</p>
Parents	Edward Richard Hickmott (1850-1923) and Elizabeth Margaret Dean(s) (1856-bef 1911) who were married at Woolwich in 1877 and had five children.

Personal details	<p>Born at Frittenden in Kent in around 1894, Charles Hickmott enlisted in the Buffs (East Kent) Regiment at Ashford on 24 November 1915. He did his training in England with the regiment's 5th Battalion and was sent to France on 7 January 1917. He joined the 1st Battalion there on 27 January and was killed in action a week later. He is buried in the Maroc British Cemetery at Grenay near Bethune.</p>
Parents	<p>John Hickmott (1862-1938) and Kate Stevens (1867-1954) who were married In the West Ashford RD of Kent in 1895 and had five children, all born at children at Frittenden (see below).</p>
Paternal grandparents	<p>Probably William Hickmott (1798-1880) and Mary Wise (1807-85) who were married in the Cranbrook RD in 1857. Although still to be confirmed, we think William may have been the son of Thomas Hickmott and Mary Ann Wraight.</p>

Personal details	<p>1. Born at Buckhurst Hill in Essex in 1886, Charles Hickmott married Ethel Faulkner in London in 1912. He enlisted in the 8th (Reserve) Cyclist Battalion of the Essex Regiment on 10 October 1914 but was discharged 12 days later having been found medically unfit. He enlisted again on 6 April 1915 and served as a private soldier in the 6th Battalion The Buffs (East Kent) Regiment. He embarked for active service overseas on 24 September 1915 and died of wounds at Bethune in France on 20 March 1916. Charles is buried in the Bethune Town Cemetery.</p> <p>Charles and Ethel had three children all born at Ilford in Essex:</p> <p>1) Charles Frederick Hickmott (1913-81) who married Evangeline Amelia Ganderton (1914-92) at East Ham in Essex in 1939. We believe Charles and Evangeline had two children;</p> <p>2) James Daniel Hickmott (1914-) who married Minnie Florence Pile (1911-93) at Ilford in 1953. Personal details	<p>Born at Tunbridge Wells in Kent in around 1894, David Hickmott was working as a cycle engineer when he enlisted in the Royal Irish Regiment at Maidstone on 25 January 1898 (his application was witnessed by a Sgt Edward R. Hickmott of the Royal West Kent Regiment). He saw military service in South Africa and India before, in 1914, being sent to France with the British Expeditionary Force. He later served in the Salonika campaign where he suffered a cerebral haemorrhage possibly caused by the bout of malaria he contracted in India. He was repatriated to England and then posted to Cork in Ireland where he died in hospital on 21 June 1918.</p> <p>While at Rawal Pindi in India, David married Irene Winter (1883-1964), the daughter of Thomas and Louisa Frederica Winter nee Volkens on 20 November 1906. He and Irene had two children:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Charles Thomas Hickmott (1910-83) who emigrated to Australia sometime prior to his first marriage to Valda Davis in Sydney in 1933. They divorced in 1947 and Charles married Mary Margaret Ryde (1920-93) with whom he had two children: Jacqueline and Stephen Charles Hickmott. 2. Dorothy Winifred Hickmott who was born at Nasirabad in India in 1911 and later lived with her mother and step-father, Walter George Baldrey, in Sydney. We don't think she married.

Personal details	Born at Tunbridge Wells in around 1900, Edward James Hickmott served as a private soldier in the 7 th Battalion of the London Regiment and was killed in action on 23 August 1918 during the allied 'Advance to Victory' in the Picardy and Artois region of France. He has no known grave and is memorialized on the Vis-en-Artois Memorial at Pas de Calais in France.
Parents	Edward Hickmott (1870- 1954) and Minnie Humphrey (1871-1959) who were married at Tunbridge Wells in Kent on 23 July 1892 and had at least seven children four of whom were still living in 1911.
Paternal grandparents	James Hickmott , (1826-78), sawyer, and Frances Hodskin Waters who were married at Ticehurst in Kent in 1848 and had nine children we are aware of.

Personal details	Born at Bromley in Kent in around 1895, Edward George Hickmott was working as a painter when he enlisted at Bromley on 15 November 1915. He was sent to France on 16 September 1916 and was posted as missing in action on 7 June 1917 probably in Flanders in Belgium where his death is memorialized on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial. His military record and the Commonwealth War Graves commission website tells us he was the son of John and Charlotte Ann Alice Hickmott of 33 Havelock Road, Bromley in Kent. His military record further indicates he was not married and had two sisters: Amelia Whitehead (30) of 82 Oakley Road Bromley and Alice Hickmott (28) who was then living with her parents at Bromley.
Parents	John Hickmott (1863- 1938) and Charlotte Ann Alice Hills (1868-1932) who were married at Penge in Surrey on 17 February 1889 and had six children, three of whom had died before 1911.
Paternal grandparents	John and Charlotte's marriage certificate states that John was the son of George Hickmott and Charlotte the daughter of Thomas Hills.

The 1911 census shows the seventeen year-old Edward Peter Hickmott living with his family at Shoreditch in London and working as a salesman for a boot manufacturer. We know little of his military service beyond the fact he was living in Kingsland at the time of his enlistment, served in the 7th Battalion of the Rifle Brigade and died of wounds in France on 16 September 1916. He is buried in the Dartmoor Cemetery at Becordel-Becourt. The list of soldiers' effects on Ancestry.com site indicates his mother was M. Hickmott. 2. Born at Shoreditch in London in around 1897, James Hickmott served as a private soldier in the 15th Battalion of the Royal Irish Rifles and was killed in action in France on 23 August. He is commemorated on the Pozieres Memorial. The Commonwealth War Graves site tells us he was the son of Mrs M. A. Hickmott of 50 Dunloe Street in Hackney.

Personal details	<p>The record of his death tells us Edwin Hickmott was born in Tunbridge Wells while we think it may actually have been at nearby Brenchley. He enlisted at Woolwich not far from his residence at Belvedere (near Erith where he was married). We know nothing of his service beyond the fact he was allocated to the 2/8th Battalion of the Sherwood Foresters and died of wounds in the 6th General Hospital in Rouen in France on 10 May 1917. He is buried in the St Sever Cemetery Extension at Rouen. Ancestry's register of soldiers' effects shows that his wife was Catherine Hickmott. This was Catherine McAvoy (1891-1962) who, according to the McAvoy Family Tree on Ancestry, Edwin married at St Fidelis Catholic Church in Erith on 6 February 1917. She was born in Cumberland, the daughter of Thomas McAvoy (1854-1910) and Sarah McCormick (1861-1939). We don't think they had any children.</p>
Parents	<p>Although still to be confirmed we think Edwin's parents were Charles Hickmott and Fanny Wilmshurst who were married at Brenchley on 3 April 1874 and had nine children we know of, all born at children at Frittenden (see below).</p>

Personal details	Born at Bow in London in around 1886, Frank Leonard Hickmott was enlisted at Dartford and was killed in action in France on 9 October 1916 and is buried in the AIF Burial Ground at Flers. The National Probate Calendar tells us that Frank was of The Court Longfield in Kent and 16 Guernsey Grove, Croxted Road in Herne Hill in Surrey and his probate was granted to Albert Edward Quaife, an incorporated accountant.
Parents	John Joseph Hickmott (1840- 19323) and Adelaide Mary Nightingale (1850- 1932) who were married at bromley in Kent on 10 August 1871 and had twelve children eleven of whom were still living in 1911.

Personal details	Born at Maidstone in Kent in around 1888, Oliver Hickmott was working as a publisher's clerk in Kingston-Upon-Thames in Greater London in 1911. He married Sarah Elizabeth 'Sally' Nobbs (1891-1971), daughter of Albert and Elizabeth Nobbs nee Child, at Watford in 1916. Although still to be confirmed, we think he had already enlisted and was serving with the 12 th Battalion of the Rifle Brigade. We know nothing of his military service beyond that he died of wounds on 14 June 1917 while at either St George's Military Hospital at Stockport or Manchester's Western General Hospital, Oliver is buried in the Kingston-Upon-Thames Cemetery. At the time of his death, Sarah was living at 40 Hagden Lane in Watford. We don't think she and Oliver had any children.

Personal details	Born at Christchurch in New Zealand in 1894, Rupert was educated at Christchurch Boys High School and played cricket for both Canterbury and New Zealand (touring Australia in 1913-14). He enlisted in the NZ Expeditionary Force and served as a 2Lt in the 2 nd Battalion of the Canterbury Regiment. He embarked for France on 4 March 1916 and was killed in action on the Somme on 24 September the same year. He is commemorated on the Caterpillar Valley (New Zealand) Memorial at Longueval. He did not marry.
Parents	George Hickmott (1867-1928) and Martha Rix (1867-1940) who were married in Sydney NSW in 1892 and had two sons we are aware of, both born at Christchurch.
Paternal grandparents	Walter Hickmott (1832-72) and Eleanor Dawes (1831-) who were married in the Maidstone RD of Kent in 1859 and had five children there. Walter was born at Maidstone in 1832, the son of William and Elizabeth Sarah Hickmott nee Cork who were married at Maidstone in 1816.

Personal and service details	1. Born at Christchurch near Eastbourne in Sussex in 1892, Stephen Hickmott enlisted in the Kings Royal Rifle Corps on 1 October 1907. His attestation papers state he was then 18 years old (he was actually 15) and working as a milk carrier. He later transferred to the Royal Sussex Regiment and served in Ireland between 1908 and 1910. Due to leave the Army in October 1914, he was recalled from pre-discharge furlough and sent with the British Expeditionary Force to France where was killed in action near Vendresse on 18 September 1914. His body was never recovered and his death is commemorated on the La Ferte-Sous-Jouarre Memorial at Seine-et-Marne in France. 2. Stephen's older brother, Henry Hickmott , was born at Eastbourne in 1887 and married Bertha Tester (1890-1931) there in 1911 (Bertha and her mother and two sisters were boarding with the Hickmott family at Eastbourne at the time). Henry and Bertha

	had one daughter we are aware of: Queenie M. Hickmott who was born in Eastbourne in 1912 and married Roy H. Reed there in 1935. We don't know the details of Henry's Army service beyond the fact he enlisted at Eastbourne and seems to have also served in the Royal West Surrey Regiment. He was killed in action in the Western European Theatre on 6 August 1917 and is buried at the Messines Ridge British Cemetery.
